
Community based Intervention initiative on Anti Human Trafficking


Diamond Harbour

Sensitization Program through Street play - Diamond Harbour



KMWSC Facilitated Street Drama on 23rd and 24th October 2018, in different villages of Diamond Harbour I block to sensitize the community regarding the impact of trafficking in the life of an adolescent girl and the vulnerability of the children leads to the risk of them being sucked into this trade. The purpose was to enhance the capacity of the individuals and communities to identify the harmful social components and protect themselves from the unsocial traps to ensure a healthy environment to survive.









Peer Group Training Program on Anti Human Trafficking – Diamond Harbour

Every adult citizen is responsible to safeguard children and to teach them the skills to be safe. KMWSC facilitated 3 days training Programme at Diamond Harbour I block on 9th to 11th October 2018 for the adolescent girls to train them on how to keep themselves safe from unwanted situations and people at the risk of being trafficked. The Children were also taught on how to aware their friends from anti-social elements like trafficking, child marriage, child labour, etc. to ensure a safety net within the community.

Stitching Active Calcutta (SAC), Netherlands visits Canning

It was really an honour to have with us Mrs. Joke Janson, Mr. Peter and Mr. Hans from Stitching Active Calcutta (SAC), Netherlands on 5th November 2018. We from KMWSC are grateful for their continued support over the past years in touches lives. The team with Sr. Monica Suchiang, Director of KMWSC visited the Anti Human Trafficking Project locations in Canning, West Bengal where they interacted with the community members and Women Police Officials.









Ms. Ajitha Menon, Political Economy Advisor, British Deputy High Commission Kolkata visited Diamond Harbour on 26th November 2018 to monitor the activities of Kolkata Mary Ward Social Centre. She visited the village of Basuldanga and Dearak where we conducted a school level workshop at Panchagram Pramathanath High School and a Community Vigilance Group Meeting. The response from the students was very encouraging. They were interested to attend such kind of workshops again and again. After this fruitful workshop, the team conducted CVC meeting with the Uttar Dearak CVC members. The CVC members shared their experiences with Kolkata Mary ward Social Centre, their learning through KMWSC intervention and the area based social problems they faced. The meeting was very successful. Ms. Ajitha Menon interacted with the community members and was very pleased with the response.

Legal Advocacy Workshop conducted by the British Deputy High Commission, Kolkata



British Deputy High Commission, Kolkata arranged a workshop on "Combating Gender Based Violence through Legal Sensitization and Capacity Building" in collaboration with FICCI Flo, Kolkata on 21st to 23rd November '18 at their office premises in Kolkata. The main objective of the workshop was to inculcate the NGO partners towards initiating activities headed for eliminating gender based violence in the their project implementing areas. The workshop was well designed with participatory activities along with group drama, group presentation, panel discussion with NGOs and lawyers.

Auto Awareness Program - Canning Block I

The Anti-Human Trafficking project conducted 2 days of Auto campaign on the 14th and 15th of October 2018 covering canning I Block city centre and 10 villages. The campaign is a mass communication method of spreading the awareness against Human Trafficking and Child Marriages. The Auto (a three wheeled motorized vehicle) meandered and manoeuvred through the villages. "Beware of people who can traffic your children" - rented the air through a loud speaker mounted on top of the auto. People gathered and informative leaflets were distributed. Six canning field associates conducted the programme very efficiently. As it was the festive time in Kolkata which would have gigantic crowds and have possibilities of Children being trafficked, this Auto Awareness campaign gave a clear message to the mass at large.



Children's Day Celebration – Canning Women's Police Station



Children's Day was celebrated in partnership with the Canning Women Police Station. The Program was child friendly and had a lot of fun added to it .The Program was graced by the Director of KMWSC Sr. Monica Suchiang who said " Children are not only the future of our nation but also the present ". Therefore we need to secure the present generation of children from all dangers and unwanted consequences. She commended the Canning Police both Women and General Police Station for their relentless efforts for securing the children in their areas. The Program brought the 10 Gram Panchayat areas children in close proximity with the police who were also actively participating in the events through songs, dance, poetry and games. Under the Gram Panchayats from Matla 1, Matla 2, Dighirpar, Goplapur, Itkhola, Nikarighata, Taldi, Daria Hatpukuria and Bansra 100 Children came from these villages along with their escorts . The Police and the Children mingled freely, the canning Women Officer In Charge Smt. Munmun Chowdhury gave a short speech. She appreciated the efforts done by KMWSC. The Children said that they never had have experienced such interactions with the Police on a Children's Day ever. We are thankful to the district administration, the police, and the village community members for all their continued support for making the Children's Day Event meaningful.

Capacity Building Training on Trafficking of Persons - Prevention, Protection and Rehabilitation

A Capacity building Training program was organised on Trafficking of person on 22nd September 2018 at KMWSC office. 41 participants and staffs participated in this workshop. There was active participation through method of Lecture, sharing of case histories, distribution of Information Education materials on Trafficking (Prevention, Protection and Rehabilitation.)





SCHOOL SENSITISATION PROGRAMME - CANNING BLOCK: I

12 Schools from 10 Gram Panchayats in Canning I block were sensitized on different child protection issues. This programme is held yearly with the collaboration of the West Bengal Woman Police. The scheme of "Saynagsidha" which is part of the West Bengal government programme is conducted by the Anti Human Trafficking Project- Canning I. The School children were sensitized on the issues of Anti Human Trafficking, Child Marriage, Rights of a Child and how to identify a potential trafficker and the Impacts .The children are aware of the number 1098 a toll free line where children can directly call and ask for help. The children are now aware of the age when they can legally get married The children are also aware about the women police station where a Police officer is designated just for them. The children know about their rights. The children has voiced that they will be vocal about child marriage and trafficking in their community.



The women are introduced to vocational training as they are very much in need of income generating means. The concern lies about the adolescents as they often get strayed away at this juncture of their life. Thus they are given life skill training. The community leaders promised to support us in mobilizing the community. The Pradhan and his members shared about the schemes with which they can help the children and the community. We received assurance from the Pradhan and the community leaders that they are committed and willing to help us for the development of Chaulgola community.

Health Camp at Sonapota and Chaulgola



Health Camps were conducted at Sonapota on 21st November 2018 and Chaulgola on 27th November 2018. Our Aim in organizing the Health Camp was to reach out to the children and community members who are unwell and need medical attention. We reached out to over 263 beneficiaries getting the care and support through these health camps



Sports Day Celebration at Chaulgola

The much awaited Sports Day was held in Chaulgola Lotus child centre on Monday 10th December 2018 .The venue was decorated with streamers and balloons, with great zeal, excitement and frolicsome atmosphere. Approximately 200 children and women of the community participated in the customized and fun-filled track and field events. An impressive March Past of the adolescent boys group set the tone of the day for the rest of the event. Once the races began, the air was filled with cheering and tons of encouragement for the participants. The campus Reverberated with enthusiastic cheers from the spectators.









The Barefoot Teachers' Training Programme

Barefoot Teachers' Training Level II

Barefoot has stepped forward and started its level-II programme from 25th of October to 27th October 2018. 20 teachers participated in the training programme. 12 of them have travelled a long distance from Jharkhand and Bihar and 8 teachers had joined from Kolkata. Among the teachers 18 were female and 2 were male. In level-II emphasis was given on book based knowledge on Language development, number development and Environmental studies .Government based books of primary level are being followed for the training as book based knowledge is essential for higher classes. Child centric and activity based methodologies were used to enhance the capacity of the participants.

Feedback that has come out from the training is much enthusiastic. According to them the training was more useful and more of interactions. They have been benefitted much from the level I. They have shared an interesting aspect that sometimes if they skip a line from rhymes the students help them to recapitulate the line. Therefore they are hopeful with the level –II training. Students will gain advantages from new method and technology.



Barefoot Teachers Training - Teachers of Brickfield Project

In the third quarter Barefoot had arranged two trainings till the mid November 2018. Both the trainings were coordinated at KMWSC premises. The training followed the methodologies of playful and joyful learning based on activity. The main objective of the training is to impart formal education in an informal way to the teacher and at the same time to learn more in a short span of time. According to the module both level-1 and level -2 training are imparted respectively. The first training was organized with the teachers from St Teresa and St Francis School of Jharkhand. The teachers from Jharkhand were much satisfied with the level-1 training therefore they were much enthusiastic towards level-2. Twenty Four teachers travelled a long distance from Sahibganj district of Jharkhand. The training commenced with the 36 newly appointed teachers of Pujali, Akra, Kalyani, Bashirhat and Tarakeshwar of West Bengal. The main aim of the training was to make the teachers aware of the educational process that is being followed.

BFS conducted 3 days residential teachers training from 1st -3rd November 2018, for the new teachers who joined the project as a BFS teachers for all the centres in 4 district of West Bengal. They took the 3 days barefoot training for 1st level. Also they learned about BFS curriculum, topic files and ensured and signed the Child Protection policies of the organisation.

In the community meeting, the advantages and disadvantages of duck farming were discussed. During this season 25 families were given poultry and duck farming, 12 of them were successful in farming good ducks and they were encouraged to rotate the money for buying new duckling.

Sensitizing Lodha Community Members on Legal Documents

Two Lodhas mothers have been given Janani Surakha Card by which they will be getting the benefit for the pregnant mothers. After obtaining Janani Surakha Card they have opened the bank account for that they have received the birth certificate for their new born babies from Sagar Gramin Hospital. The parents' meeting was conducted on 29th October 2018 at Lodha Learning centre. There were total 50 (Male 2 female 48 participants. The main discussion was on distribution of clothes, Annual exams of Children in the month of November 2018 and for enrolment of Lodha Children at Patharpratima Hostel.

On the occasion of the Puja festival, 25 Lodha children were given clothes in the learning centre on 16th October 2018. Local club members also distributed clothes to the children.

Parents meeting were conducted on 13th November 2018 to discuss about the Children's day and visit to Patharprotima. There were total 10 participants from Lodha Community (Male - 1 female – 9). The parents were oriented about the hostel facility for the Tribal girls.

A special day was conducted for the children of Lodha learning centre. They were divided into two groups and played group games. Lodha community children are mingling with other children. Creating and inculcating the mind set of equality in the young generation. Even Lodha children will have opportunity to grow and study together along with the children of other communities.

As the whole nation celebrates CRC week in the second and third week of November, KMWSC dedicated a Day to the Children on 17/11/18. This introductory course would provide students with the opportunity to practice using computer operating systems. Introductory computer applications would train the individuals to use a wide range of computer application programs in using command keys and formatting material for ease of reading and learn to use Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint to create presentations, spreadsheets and text documents etc.

Willingness to act in fear



The 17 year old girl Prithi Nag (Name changed) from Daria Village in Canning- I rescues her friend after being trafficked . Even though of the venerable surrounding she was, Anindita got involved in community programs and was an active participant and devoted most of her time teaching the children of the sex workers in our KMWSC MAC learning Centre at Sonagachi. Today she teaches over 15 children of sex workers and aspires to complete her college and become a teacher. She says that she has a call to serve the children of the sex workers and to be an instrument of change in their lives. KMWSC is looking forward to appoint her as the tutorial teacher at their Learning centre at Sonagachi.

Motivation and Dedication leads to a new height



Rahamatullah Mollah a resident of Kalikapur village, 35 km away from Lakshikantapur block of south 24 parganas has fulfilled his dream by constructing a primary school at his own village. But he proudly says it would not have been possible without the barefoot teachers training of KMWSC. After completing his Graduation his determination and will power led him to know about the Barefoot Teachers Training. It was always at the back of his mind to receive quality training to enhance his skill and acquire knowledge about child centric and activity based methodology. He availed the training and set up his goal. But the main constrain for him was the capital. He decided to sell some off his ancestral property school. But he could not afford to construct a permanent structure. He could only able to construct a mud house with asbestos roof. But his motivation has taken to a height where no constrain had ever able to stop his noble work for the children of Kalikapur village.

According to Rahamatuallah he had to campaign throughout the village and its neighbouring areas people gradually became aware of primary education and his school. And after 5 years of laying the foundation number of candidates gradually increased to 200.Now the people from far and near send their children to Children Happy Home Kalikapur to get quality education. But still he is not satisfied with his noble work .But he is ever grateful to KMWSC'S Teachers Training Programme. He often sends his teacher to get trained from KMWSC.

Convergence Meet 2018 - Anti Human Trafficking Project



The convergence meet was organized by KMWSC to bring each and every participation from the stake holders together to understand, know and assess the anti human trafficking Initiative together and reach to ideas for future endeavours and activities. The convergence was successful as participation from the District Administration, Law enforcement agencies (Police), the Panchayat heads were present, and above all the community participated enthusiastically where the Community vigilance committee and the Adolescent Girls group from the villages, altogether 32 were present for the programme. The women Police Officer In charge of Canning I shared her experiences and explained the evils of trafficking and stated that her record shows there was a fall in the registration of cases for trafficking in comparison to 2016-2017. Ms. Sudheshna Roy member of WBCPCR gave the key note address and emphasised on the transformative minds of girls what will bring them liberation. Girls are strong and they need not submit to anyone. They should be strong and strengthen others in the community.

Inauguration of Child Friendly Corner....



The Child Friendly space of Loreto- Kolkata Mary Ward Social Centre was inaugurated at the Canning Women's Police station on 15th November 2018. The Police Station has designated a place for the Child Friendly corner and the Kolkata Mary Ward Social Centre has taken up the responsibility to set it up and give it to the Women Police Station. However KMWSC will be responsible for the upkeep and maintenance for it to look child friendly. KMWSC always upholds the cause of the children and their rights. The Children must be protected and prevented from abuse and trafficking. The Child Friendly corner gives them the right to express, explore and come and find a friendly atmosphere. KMWSC Director Sister Monica Suchaing graced the occasion with a prayer for blessings with Officer In- Charge Smt. Munmun Chowdhury and Police officials. Loreto has been in the field of education for 175 years where children had been empowered through education. KMWSC is the social wing of Loreto that is actively involved in empowering the vulnerable children.

Sensitization for Vehicles Union – Anti Human Trafficking Project

The vehicles union of canning comprising of auto drivers and Toto drivers sat through the 3 hours sensitization programme on 27th November 2018 on Anti human trafficking .Canning is a major gate way point where the three modes of travel is readily available mainly train, road and water ways and it plays a junction in the source area . One of the major transportation of public is through the Auto. Common people use this and the traffickers use this everyday vehicle to traffic girls in the guise of being parents, guardians or well wishers. Sensitising them would help them to identify any potential victims.



Participatory Consultation Meet – Anti Human Trafficking Project

The Consultation focused on "How to bring theory to practice" through specific intervention strategies to combat against trafficking at the community level. Former justice Nadera Patheriaya gave the key note address after the Director of Kolkata Mary Ward Social Centre Monica Suchiang welcome the participants. Sr. Monica said, "Our strategies have to be refined and redefined contextually and in time to challenge the perpetrators of the evil act of Trafficking." The participants comprised of notable NGOs such as Caritos, World Vision of India, Justice Venture International and others. Justice Nadera Patheriaya said "Sensitization, irradicate poverty and effective implementation of POCSO", will minimize trafficking. Dr. Joydev Majumder, Director of Joy Prokash Institute of Social Change and Mr. Mahesh Menon of National Institute of Juridical Science stressed on balance between theory and practice can be achieved through advocacy and strengthening of Village Level Child Protection Committee (VLCPC). The participants actively joined in the discussions of the five key points and their pertaining issues.
