Community Based Intervention Program Initiative of Anti – Human Trafficking

Diamond Harbour



18 monthly meetings were conducted with 8 Adolescent Groups during January to March 2019. 178 Adolescent girl group members were made aware on Child Rights and Protection issues and had access to knowledge & information on CHILDLINE services (1098)

Awareness Camp on Trafficking

1 Community awareness campaign has been conducted with Self help group mothers (SHG) members where we have reached out to 175 community people. Communities acquired knowledge on core concerns and modus operandi of traffickers at local level and the process of initiating a missing General Diary Entry (GDE)/ First Information Report under Immoral Trafficking prevention Act (ITPA) at local police station and process of availing services of District Legal aid Services and Childline (1098).

Rescue from Child Marriage

3 child marriage cases were identified by Adolescent Girl group members which has been stopped with the active intervention of the community vigilance group and AGG members. The cases were not registered in the police as the respective people were contacted by the CVC members and asked to stop the marriages in advance.

Collaboration and Networking

Close coordination with CVC members, Gram Panchayat, Police and Peer leaders through Child Tracking System has been done. Collaboration with the Block Development Office where the Officer has extended support together with the Panchayat and Police. The New Block Development Officer is very proactive and is willing to cooperate the initiatives of Campaign against Child Marriage. Regular interaction with the new Gram Panchayat administration and sharing of information with Panchayat regarding our activities of trafficking are being done.


The Anti Human Trafficking Project has managed to handle 4 Missing cases from Canning I .The operation was done in conjuntion with Child Line Canning. They are now happily reunited with their family.





The Community vigilance committee has been given 10 orientations in the Month of January 2019 of the functioning of the VLCPC in each of their village. The VLCPC as stated earlier Village Level Child Protection committee is a statutory

body where elected representatives along with civil society form the groups. It is a very powerful body but is hardly functional because of its political allegiance and unsupportive members due to their lack of awareness and training. Training the key CVC members as resource person for their own village and for the capacity building of others in adjacent villages is required. The CVC members will be given advanced Training of Teachers to disseminate information and empower others. They will be encouraged to take steps to strengthen the VLCPC.



SURVEYS

A Demographic Survey has been completed in the 10 villages of Canning 1 with the Sample size of 50 families in each village. Community outreach and rapport building is being done in 3 Gram Panchayats in Canning II . The main objective of the survey is to have an understanding of our target audience and the response of our ongoing intervention.

Hidden Domestic Child Labour



The facilitators of Muraripukur and Rajabazar Multipurpose Activity Centres enrolled 4 children in the nearby Government Schools in this quarter. At these Multipurpose Activity Centres the children are taught basic education and prepared grounding for them to get enrolled back or mainstream in the schools. Our field facilitators and staff have been counselling the parents frequently on the importance of Education and how important it was to send

their Children to School. We hope that by the end of this year we could reach to more children in mainstreaming them back to school.



Awareness program conducted in Sikha Niketan School Muraripukur, Kolkata on 15th March 2019 was a great networking initiative by KMWSC team, to intervene with them in the classroom and stimulate transversal skills – to speak in public, to develop an argument with a critical mind and to

make them want to act and collectively build a just , solidarity. The sessions were mainly based on Child Rights and Child Protection issues for 55 adolescent girls and 5 teachers of classes VII to X. They started with icebreaking session of telling something good about their friend sitting at the right. The video clipping at the beginning of the session grabbed the attention and interest of the girls on the prepared topic, followed by questions, interaction and feedback from the group. There was active participation from the entire group with clarifications and queries. The teachers thanked the team and expressed that these kind of awareness sessions needs to be done regularly for the adolescent girls to give them proper guidance to face the reality and the society.



Hidden Domestic Child labour Project organized auto campaigning for Vocational training through leaflet distribution to the mass public for enrolments at 5 major points of the City. The Awareness Drive was to have more of young people with potentials to get enrolled at our specialized training Programs of Tailoring, Beautician and Computer Courses. Altogether 154 young people got enrolled for the above courses.





The Hidden Domestic Child Labour project organized a school awareness program on 27th March 2019 at Sukanta Nagar Vidya Niketan Higher Secondary school, Kolkata. 55 children and 3 teachers were sensitized on Child Rights and Protection, through effect???

Barefoot Teachers' Training Programme



Barefoot teachers' training conducted their first training for the year 2019, a 4 day residential program from 15th January 2019 to 18th January 2019 at KMWSC Training Centre . We could reach out and train 40 potential teachers from Basirhat, Bolpur, South 24 Parganas and Garia, Kolkata. The resource person along with the participants

demonstrated the methodologies of theoretical parts. Language development and number development which were the main concerns of the training. Both the development was demonstrated with the help of action games, song, rhymes. Look and say card and conversation sheet were defined to maintain the strategy of Language Development. Micro teaching was implemented so that the resource person could get an idea of the capability of the trainees along with the preparation of teaching and learning material. The participants were imparted with the right knowledge which would rather be beneficial to our prospective teachers. `



Barefoot Teachers' Training Program conducts its second training from 28th January to 31st January 2019



at KMWSC Training Centre with 10 candidates from Tarakeshwar, Kalyani, Sonarpur and Narendrapur, South 24 Parganas , West Bengal. The Level-1 training was advocated to them which started with language Development. Different theoretical discussion was delivered to them regarding language enhancement. Practical training started with phonetics. They were introduced with vowel and consonant. The participants were shown the technique of preparing teaching learning materials. The concluding day there was theoretical discussions on Education which was the theme of the training. Storytelling with dramatization and conversation with real object was oriented to them. The training ended with Micro teaching and displaying of all the teaching learning material. Last but not the least certificates were distributed among all the candidates. The feedback of the training was outstanding, the teachers were much curious to know about each and every detail of the training.

Education Department for the admission opportunities for our children of the Brick Field School Project centres.





Solar Enlightened and Community Empowerment Project Gosaba , The Sundarbans





50 Solar Lamps were distributed to families of Chadipur, Bipradashpur and Gosaba area of the Sundarbans on 17th ,18th and 19th January 2019. These families have been doing their daily chores without electricity for many years. They have been using kerosene lamps and fire wood sticks for daily visibility after dark. The children were also unable to study after dark but after getting these Solar Lamps their lives have changed. They are very thankful to

KMWSC for assisting them with solar lamps.









2 Awareness Campaigns were conducted in Gosaba , Bipradashpur under the Sudarbans area . Through these events we could share the right use of Solar Energy and how it was helpful to us in our daily life. A sample Solar Lamp was also demonstrated to the community after dark on the visibility and power of the light just by charging the solar panel during day while they are at work , which later could be

used at a stretch of 4-5 hrs. The communities have given a positive response after our recent follow ups in the month of February and March 2019.





21 Self Help Group Meetings were conducted in Gosaba , Chadipur and Bipradashpur . These groups have been formed to initiate a savings account to help and give aid to each other during economic crisis . These groups have also been strengthened to facilitate the use and follow up of Solar lamps in their neighbourhood .





70 Home Visits have been done in all the 3 villages of Sundarbans (Gosaba, Chadipur and Bipradashpur) to have a follow up on how the families are using the Solar lamps and how helpful it is for them in their daily life. It has been communicated to them that if there are any technical faults in the lamp to report or intimate the concerned staff at Gosaba. But our Home visits are not only limited to solar use but also building relationships and sharing any concerns or problems which the families or any individual would like to share. It is all about standing by to help each other.







The staffs of KMWSC visits Governments officials of Gosaba , Chadipur and Bipradashpur on 7th and 8th of March 2019 . Mr Abhijit Paul , Officer in Charge of Gosaba Police , Mr Sourabh Mitra , Block Development officer of Gosaba and Mr. Amaresh Mondal , Pradhan of Bipradashpur .The Staffs shared about the ongoing Solar Interventions in the 3 villages of Sundarbans and the response from each of the community . The officials expressed they concerns too and were grateful to the team to provide light to some of the most interior villages of the Sundarbans where electricity is a major constraint. They assured us of further collaboration and help needed in the days to come.
